The Malaysian Federation of Lasallian Alumni Associations (MFOLSA) is an umbrella organisation for all La Salle Alumni Associations in Malaysia.

It was launched in December 1976 at St Xavier's Institution, Penang, by five such bodies namely; Old Xaverians' Association, Penang, Old Georgians' Association, Taiping, Old Paulians' Association, Seremban, Sacred Heart Old Students' Association, Sibul, Sarawak, and Old Josephians' Association Kuching, Sarawak. Since then MFOLSA has grown in size and it has nineteen (19) Member Associations.

The presidency of the Federation used to operate on a rotational basis biannually, that is one of the incumbent presidents of a Member Association would be the host president of the MFOLSA and such elected Member Association shall host the MFOLSA for a term until the next election when the hosting of MFOLSA either remained with the same Member Association or was passed onto another Member Association whereupon the president of that chosen Member Association would then head the MFOLSA for a term.

However, after sometime the system did not work well. It didn't engage the involvement of the other Member Associations and vice-versa.

Sometime in the year 2005, Tan Sri Dato Chan Choong Tak, the then president of Old Paulians' Association Seremban and the then host president of the MFOLSA, spearheaded the overall amendments of the Rules and Constitution of MFOLSA, with the main amendments to provide for the secretariat address of the MFOLSA to be the permanent address of the MFOLSA and to allow the

President of the MFOLSA to be elected. By such amendment the President of the MFOLSA need not necessarily be the incumbent President of the chosen host Member Association. Lasallians from all Member Associations shall be elected to form the incumbent Executive Committee of the MFOLSA instead of the host Member Association dominating such committee for a term. The amendments were approved by the Registry of Societies on

the April 12, 2006.

Our commitment from the beginning as citizens of our nation has been for multicultural integration and interfaith dialogue among all our people. We have been committed to unity and fellowship founded on our Lasallian values and ethos. We want to share our Lasallian heritage, values and ethos with more young Lasallians in Asia who are in our educational institutions.

As Alumni, we have over the years served our respective educational institutions from which we received our holistic education.

MFOLSA would consistently engage with the La Salle Brothers on matters affecting La Salle schools and would continue to organise relevant dialogues and workshops to address the challenges and direction for the La Salle schools in Malaysia.
